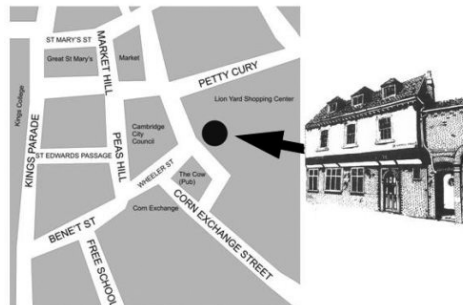

The Cambridge University Catholic Chaplaincy at Fisher House is the spiritual home for all Catholic members of the University, from undergraduates to Fellows.

Fisher House is open daily between 8.00am and 10.00pm (during term time). For the code to the external glass doors, please ask a member of the Chaplaincy Team. To enable your Cam Card to give you access to the Fisher Room and Library, please register with Fisher House through the Chaplaincy's website.

The Chapel of St John Fisher is the heart of the Chaplaincy. It is open all day.

The Fisher Room and its kitchen provide a social space for undergraduates and graduates to meet and relax during the day, with free tea and coffee.

The Fisher House Library houses an extensive collection of books of theology, scriptural study, history, and literature. The roof terrace can be accessed from it.
